Methodology - Current Wave

 This research has been conducted over multiple waves. The funding for this wave was provided by the Swedish International Development and Cooperation Agency (Sida)

Current survey wave:

- Fieldwork dates: August 18 September 3, 2013
- 3,838 completed interviews
- A nationally representative sample of Georgian speakers including Capital, Urban, Rural, East Georgia and West Georgia areas. Also additional representative samples of the self governing cities of Kutaisi, Batumi, Poti and Rustavi, as well as the districts of Telavi, Gori, Akhaltsikhe, Zugdidi and Ambrolauri.

Sample design

- NDI and CRRC use a complex survey design with both stratification and clustering
- Households are selected via random route sampling
- Respondents are selected using a Kish table
- Randomly selected households and individuals are not substituted
- All interviews are conducted face-to-face
- The average margin of error is +/- 2%

Methodology – Historical Waves

This research has been conducted over multiple waves. The funding for most waves was provided by Sida, however one
wave was funded by the Eurasia Foundation and one by the British Embassy

Historical waves:

June 2013:

- Fieldwork dates: June 12 26, 2013
- 2,338 completed interviews
- A nationally representative sample of Georgian speakers including Capital, Urban, Rural, East Georgia and West Georgia areas.
- The average margin of error does not exceed +/-2.9%




- Fieldwork dates: March 13 27, 2013
- 3,103 completed interviews
- A nationally representative sample of Georgian speakers including Capital, Urban, Rural, East Georgia and West Georgia areas.
- The average margin of error does not exceed +/- 2.5%




- Fieldwork dates: November 14 25, 2012







How do you think the situation has changed in Georgia compared to October 2012? (q2)





Politicians in Georgia talk about ... too much, the right amount or too little? (q3)














How do you think the situation has changed in Georgia compared to October 2012? (q5)




Politicians in Georgia talk about ... too much, the right amount or too little? (q6)




After the parliamentary elections of October 2012 has the level of crime in Georgia ... (q12)




After the parliamentary elections of October 2012 has the number of jobs available in Georgia ... (q11)








Do you consider yourself to be employed? (q89 X Gender)

Which of the following best describes your situation? (q91) - of the 65% who are unemployed




Georgian Employment at a Glance

The illustration to the right shows these groups as follows:

- 35%--Employed (full or part time)
- 31%--Unemployed and looking for work (This includes both unemployed and retired persons who are looking for work.)
- 5%--Unemployed and not looking for work (This includes unemployed and retired persons who are interested in a job, but who are not looking.)
- 29%--Non-active labour force (This includes students, homemakers, retired persons who are not interested in looking for a job.)




In which direction Georgia is going? (q10 X Settlement)










Which statement do you agree with the most? (q17)




What does democracy mean to you? Name up to three (q15)




In your opinion, how important or unimportant is the protection of minority rights to Georgia's democratic development? (q23)




How important or unimportant is the protection of minority rights to Georgia's democratic development? (q23 X Settlement)




When you think of minority groups, which groups come to mind first? Name up to three (q24)




How important or unimportant is the protection of the following minorities? (q25)




To what extent do you agree or disagree that the current government is making the changes that matter to you? (q13)






To what extent do you agree or disagree that if the Parliamentary opposition was in charge they would make the changes that matter to you? (q14)






Which three reforms do you think would be most important for Georgia / Which do you expect to see achieved in the next six months? Name up to three (q7/8)




What do you think are the three biggest barriers to free and fair elections in Georgia? Name up to three (q20) Part 1


An amendment to law has been passed by Parliament establishing financial incentives for parties to increase the number of women on their party lists. Do you support this amendment? (q81)






Do you approve or disapprove of 14 political parties to receive state funding as a result of receiving 3% or more in the previous elections? (q83 X Settlement)












Do you personally know someone who you believe was fired from a state/public job because of their political beliefs since October 2012? (q71)




Who is your majoritarian member in the Parliament of Georgia? (q38)




What do you expect from your majoritarian Member of the Parliament? (q37)



If your elected representative were to contact you, what would be the best form? (q39)




Have you personally been contacted by any politician or party activist since the October 2012 parliamentary elections? (q40)








Generally, comparing the performance of men and women in elected office, do you think ... (q29)




Generally, comparing the performance of men and women in elected office, do you think ... (q29 X Gender)



Generally speaking, how do you think the media portrays men and women in politics? (q30)




Currently there are 17 women members of parliament out of 150 (11%). Do you think this is . . .? (q26)






Currently there are 133 men members of parliament out of 150 (89%). Do you think this is . . .? (q32)




Which of the following statements do you agree with the most? (q46)




Which of the following statements do you agree with the most? (q46 X Settlement)






Are you satisfied or dissatisfied with Georgia's current relationship with Russia? (q47)




When do you think Georgia will be granted NATO membership? (q49)




What are your main sources of information for receiving news about Georgian politics and current events? (q50-q51)




What are the top three internet sites you visit for politics? Name up to three (q52) - of the 20% who named internet as their first or second source of information




How do you access the internet? Accept all answers (q54)




How do you receive TV signal? Accept all answers (q53)




Do you watch coverage of Georgian politics and current events on the following channels? National (q55)




Do you think that news about Georgian politics and current affairs on the following Georgian TV channels mostly reflect the interests of UNM, Georgian Dream or neither? National (q56)



How much do you trust or distrust coverage of news and current affairs on the following TV channels? National (q57)




In the past four months have you been receiving enough information from the media about the party you support? (q59)




Do you watch GPB Channel 2 which provides live coverage of Parliament and gives Free Tribune to political parties? (q58)






Where do you talk about politics? Name up to three (q75)




Where do you talk about politics? Name up to three (q75 X Gender)
