

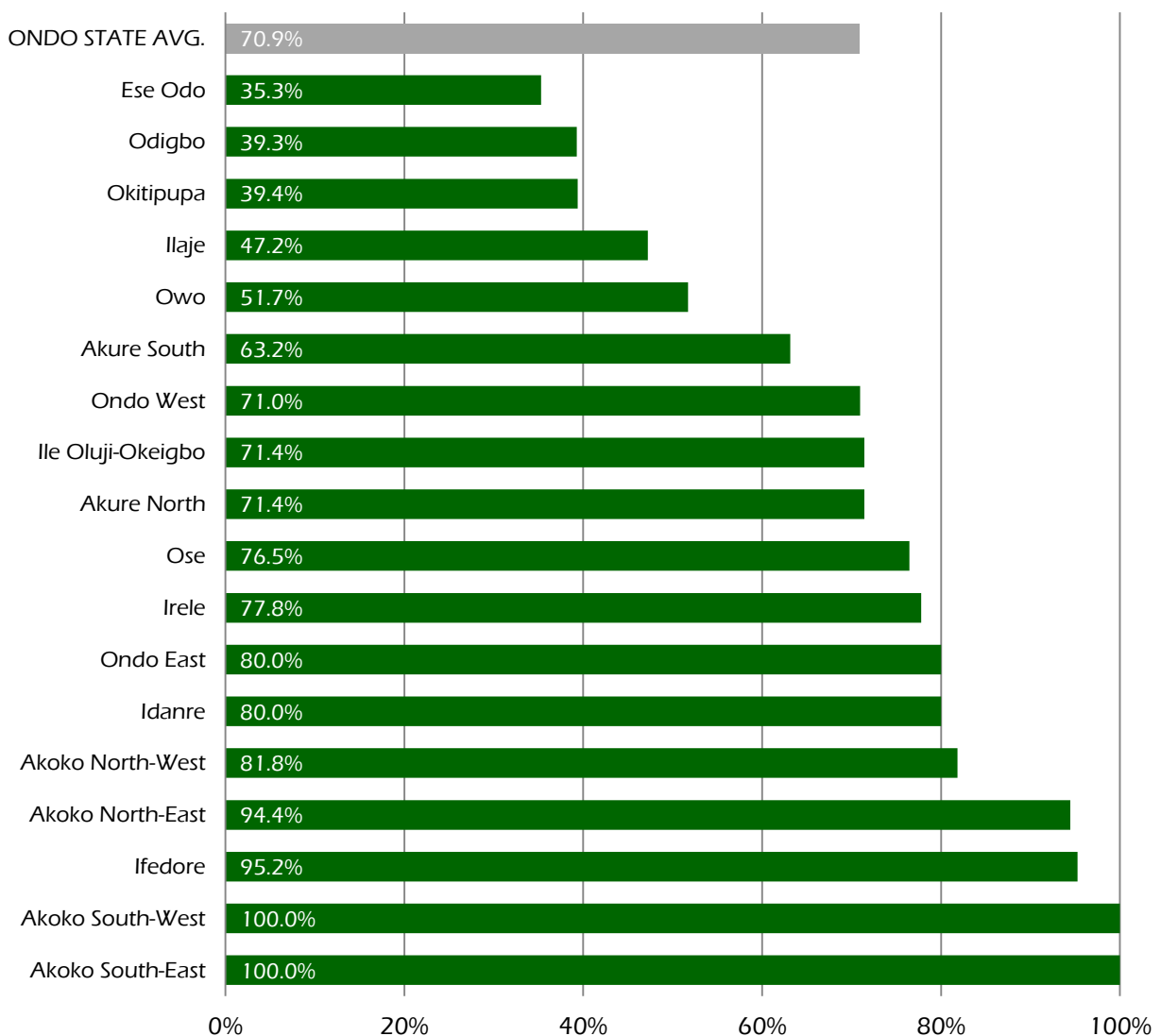
## Appendix: Comparative PSC Data on the Ondo State Election

PSC’s representative random sample-based observation methodology allows the Project to confidently comment on various part of the electoral process including the performance of INEC and voters at the state and LGA levels. The following estimates illustrate some of the more salient points from the Ondo State governorship election.

### Beginning of Accreditation

INEC specifies that accreditation of observers should begin between 8:00am and noon. The map below compares across Ondo State LGAs, what percentage had begun accreditation of voters by 9:00am.

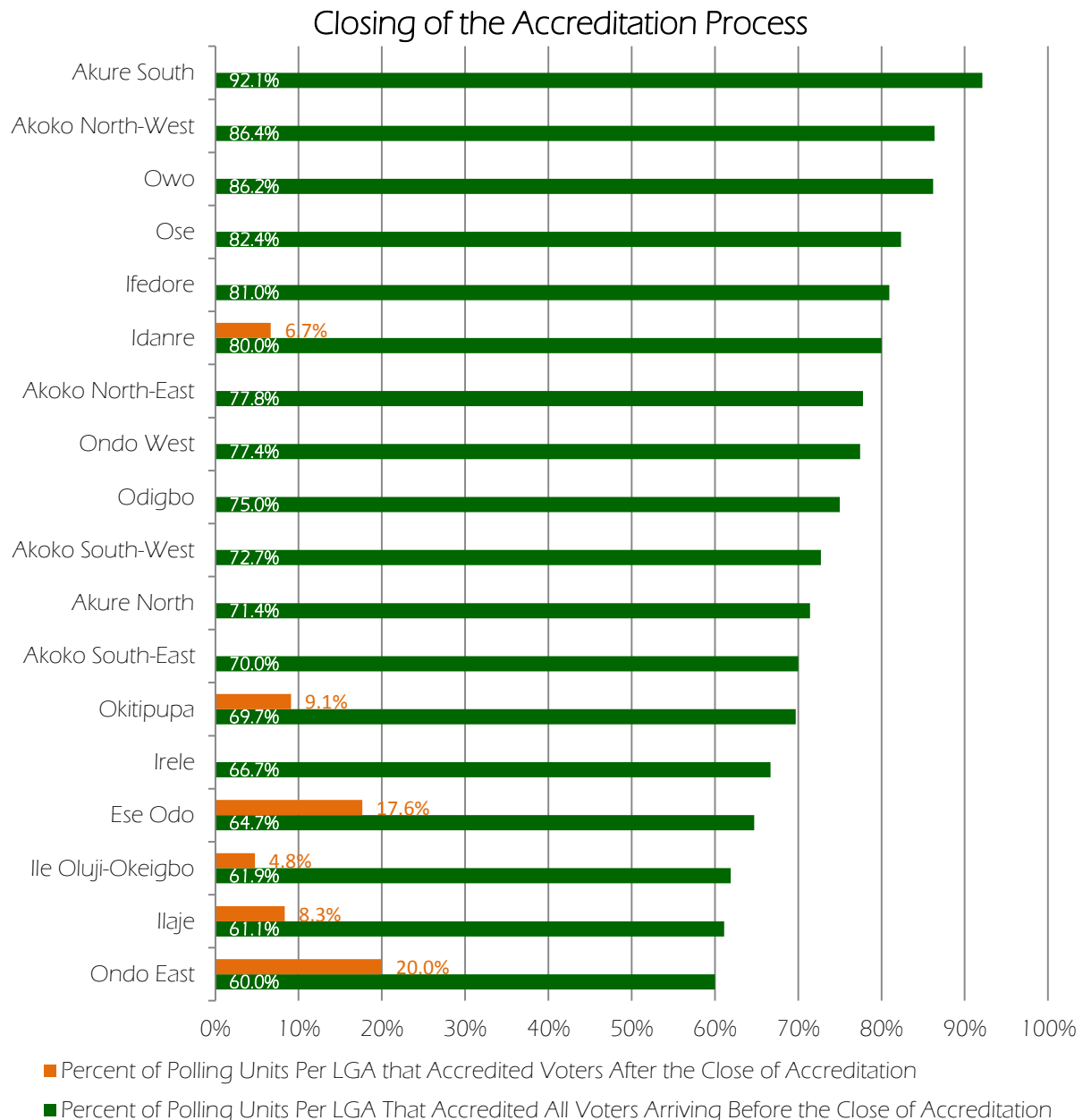
Percent of Polling Units per LGA that Began Accreditation by 9:00am



## End of Accreditation

In addition to accrediting voters, INEC instructs election officials to, at the close of the specified accreditation period, close the end of the line to prevent others from joining the accreditation queue. All registered voters in line at the close of the accreditation process are to be accredited to vote in the election.

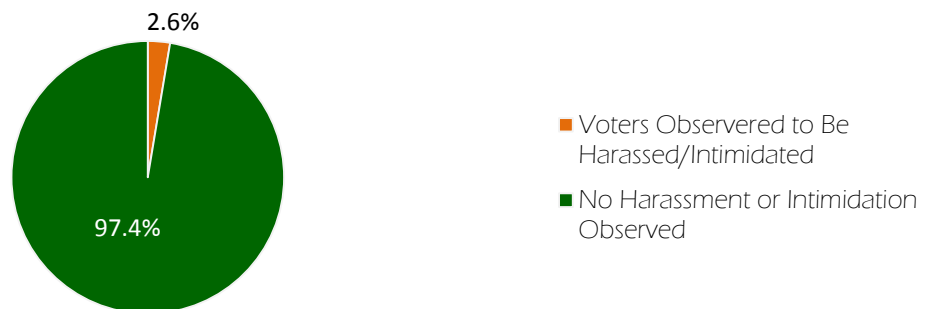
The graph below indicates the percentage of polling units in each of Ondo State's LGAs that: 1) **correctly** accredited all voters in line at the close of the accreditation process in dark green; and, 2) the percent of polling units per LGA that **incorrectly** continued to accredit voters after the close of the accreditation process in orange. If no orange bars are present, the LGA had 0% of voters accredited after the close of the accreditation process.



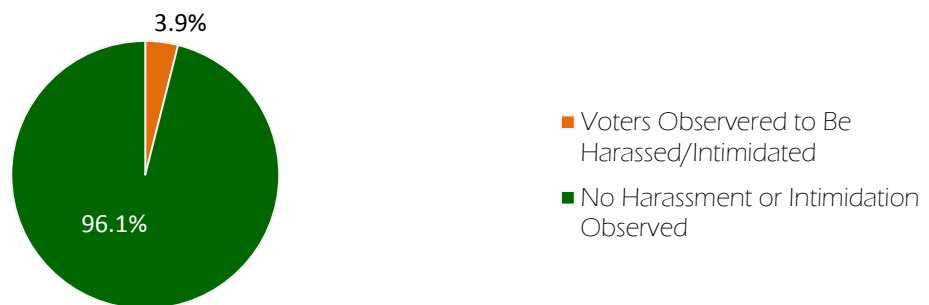
## Harassment and Intimidation at the State Level

During the Ondo State election harassment and intimidation of voters was not substantial. During the accreditation and counting processes, under 3% of polling units state-wide saw intimidation or harassment of voters. During the voting process this figure was under 4%.

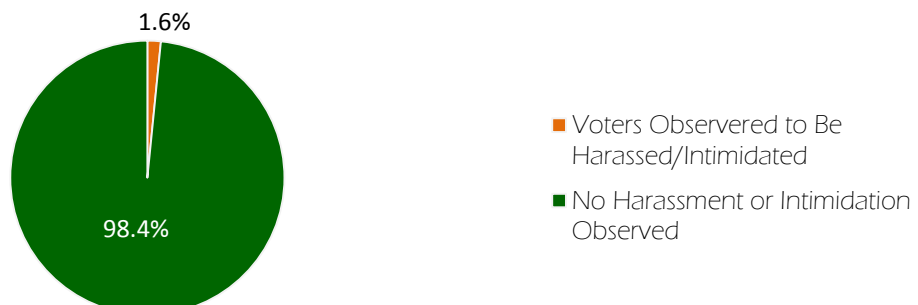
Harassment/Intimidation at Polling Units During the Accreditation Process

## Harassment at an LGA level

While it should be noted that harassment and intimidation was low across Ondo State overall, LGAs affected were concentrated. Eso Odo, Indanre, Ondo East and Ilaje LGAs had high amounts of harassment and intimidation at various stages of the electoral process. Specifically troubling is that Ondo East LGA experienced harassment and intimidation at 20% of its polling units during the voting process.
