Methodology - Current Wave

 This research has been conducted over multiple waves. The funding for this wave was provided by the Swedish International Development and Cooperation Agency (Sida)

Current survey wave:

- Fieldwork dates: November 13 27, 2013
- 3,915 completed interviews
- A nationally representative sample of Georgian speakers including Capital, Urban, Rural, East Georgia and West Georgia areas. Also additional representative samples of the self governing cities of Kutaisi, Batumi, Poti and Rustavi, as well as the districts of Telavi, Gori, Akhaltsikhe, Zugdidi and Ambrolauri.

Sample design

- NDI and CRRC use a complex survey design with both stratification and clustering
- Households are selected via random route sampling
- Respondents are selected using a Kish table
- Randomly selected households and individuals are not substituted
- All interviews are conducted face-to-face
- The average margin of error is +/- 2%

Methodology – Historical Waves

- This research has been conducted over multiple waves. The funding for most waves was provided by Sida,
 however one wave was funded by the Eurasia Foundation and one by the British Embassy
- Historical waves:

September 2013

- Fieldwork dates: August 18 September 3, 2013
- 3,838 completed interviews
- A nationally representative sample of Georgian speakers including Capital, Urban, Rural, East Georgia
 and West Georgia areas. Also additional representative samples of the self governing cities of Kutaisi,
 Batumi, Poti and Rustavi, as well as the districts of Telavi, Gori, Akhaltsikhe, Zugdidi and Ambrolauri.
- The average margin of error does not exceed +/-2%

June 2013:

- Fieldwork dates: June 12 26, 2013
- 2,338 completed interviews
- A nationally representative sample of Georgian speakers including Capital, Urban, Rural, East Georgia and West Georgia areas.
- The average margin of error does not exceed +/-2.9%




- Fieldwork dates: March 13 27, 2013
- 3,103 completed interviews
- A nationally representative sample of Georgian speakers including Capital, Urban, Rural, East Georgia and West Georgia areas.
- The average margin of error does not exceed +/- 2.5%

November 2012


- Fieldwork dates: November 14 25, 2012
- 1,947 completed interviews
- A nationally representative sample including capital, urban, rural, East Georgia and West Georgia areas
- The average margin of error does not exceed +/- 3%






How do you think the situation has changed in Georgia compared to October 2012? (q2)




Politicians in Georgia talk about ... too much, the right amount or too little? (q3)



















How do you think the situation has changed in Georgia compared to October 2012? (q5)




Politicians in Georgia talk about ... too much, the right amount or too little? (q6)




After the parliamentary elections of October 2012 has the number of jobs available in Georgia... (q11)




After the parliamentary elections of October 2012 has the level of crime in Georgia... (q12)








Do you consider yourself to be employed? (q95 X Age)

The illustration to the right shows these groups as follows:


- 31%--Employed (full or part time)
- 32%--Unemployed and looking for work (This includes both unemployed and retired persons who are looking for work.)
- 5%--Unemployed and not looking for work (This includes unemployed and retired persons who are interested in a job, but who are not looking.)
- 32%--Non-active labour force (This includes students, homemakers, retired persons who are not interested in looking for a job.)










How important is the protection of minority rights to Georgia's democratic development? (q21)




How important or unimportant is the protection of minority rights to Georgia's democratic development? (q21 X Settlement)




When you think of minority groups, which groups come to mind first? Name up to three. (q22)






To what extent do you agree or disagree that the current government is making the changes that matter to you? (q13)






To what extent do you agree or disagree that if the Parliamentary opposition was in charge they would make the changes that matter to you? (q14)






To what extent do you agree or disagree that if the non-Parliamentary opposition was in charge they would make the changes that matter to you? (q15)




Which three reforms do you think would be most important for Georgia / Which do you expect to see achieved in the next six months? Name up to three (q7/8)




What do you think are the three biggest barriers to free and fair elections in Georgia? Name up to three (q64) Part 1




What do you think are the three biggest barriers to free and fair elections in Georgia? Name up to three (q64) Part 2




Did you encounter any problems with the voters' list during the Election Day? (q75)












Which campaign activities were most helpful to you when making your decision on who to vote for? (q73)




Did you discuss your vote with others prior to Election Day? (q76)




How do you think the October 27 presidential/October 1 parliamentary elections were conducted? (q78)










Once Mikheil Saakashvili leaves the office of president, which of the following do you think is most likely to happen? (q58)




Do you personally know someone who you believe was fired from a state/public job because of their political beliefs since October 2012? (q83 X Settlement)




Who is your majoritarian member in the Parliament of Georgia? (q31)




What do you expect from your majoritarian Member of the Parliament? (q30)




If your elected representative were to contact you, what would be the best form? (q33)




Comparing the performance of men and women in elected office, do you think...? (q27)




Comparing the performance of men and women in elected office, do you think... (q27 X Gender)



All things being equal, would you prefer to vote for a man or a woman candidate? (q25)









Are you satisfied or dissatisfied with Georgia's current relationship with Russia? (q41)








Which of the following two statements do you agree with? (q44)




When do you think Georgia will be granted NATO membership? (q43)




What are your main sources of information for receiving news about Georgian politics and current events? (q45-q46)




What are the top three internet sites you visit for politics? (q47) - of the 19% who named internet as their first or second source of information




Do you watch coverage of Georgian politics and current events on the following channels? National (q48)




Do you think that news about Georgian politics and current affairs on the following Georgian TV channels mostly reflect the interests of UNM, Georgian Dream or neither? National (q49)




How much do you trust or distrust coverage of news and current affairs on the following TV channels? National (q50) Part 1




In the past four months have you been receiving enough information from the media about the party you support? (q52)




Do you watch GPB Channel 2 which provides live coverage of Parliament and gives Free Tribune to political parties? (q51)




In general, with whom do you talk about politics? (q84)




Where do you talk about politics? (q85) of the 58 % who talk about politics




Where do you talk about politics? (q85 X Gender) of the 58 % who talk about politics
