## NDI WELCOMES INTERNATIONAL VISITORS DURING DEMOCRATIC NATIONAL CONVENTION

WASHINGTON, D.C.—The National Democratic Institute (NDI) announced today that it will host more than 300 diplomats and political leaders from more than 100 countries in Charlotte, N.C., at this year's Democratic National Convention. The visitors are part of NDI's International Leaders Forum (ILF), which the Institute has hosted during every Democratic National Convention since 1984.

NDI's guests include current and former heads of state, cabinet ministers, members of parliament, political party leaders and more than 100 ambassadors who are members of the Washington-based diplomatic corps.

"This unique program gives leaders from around the world and across the political spectrum the opportunity to see the American democratic process at work first hand," said former Secretary of State Madeleine K. Albright, chairman of NDI. "We hope our visitors will gain a better understanding of the U.S. political system and that their experiences in Charlotte will spark meaningful conversations at home about the future of democracy in their own countries."

In addition to observing the convention proceedings, participants will take part in a series of bipartisan panel discussions covering topics that include the U.S. political process, foreign and domestic policy issues, and media coverage of the presidential race. They will also have the opportunity to exchange ideas informally with counterparts from other countries.

"NDI is proud to once again welcome so many distinguished guests from around the world," said Kenneth Wollack, president of NDI. "Opportunities like this that foster the exchange of ideas and expertise can help promote more open, accountable governments. ILF reinforces the work that NDI carries out with political parties, parliaments, civic organizations and others around the globe."

ILF is privately funded by donations from individuals, foundations and corporations.

NDI's convention programs, which will be held at Charlotte's Belk Theater, are open to media and to the public. Media credentials will be issued upon sign-in at the Belk. Free tickets for the public may be reserved <a href="here">here</a> and are required for admittance.
