# Taking Georgians' pulse

Findings from October-November 2023 face to face survey

Fieldwork carried out for NDI by CRRC Georgia

Research is funded by the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland through the foreign, commonwealth and development office's good governance fund.

### RESEARCH GOALS

- →To foster the development of more responsive policies and governance in Georgia;
- →To help stakeholders diagnose and address top national concerns and priorities, around the following topics: economy, institutions, foreign affairs, women's political participation, and other.

### October-November 2023 FACE TO FACE POLL

- Fieldwork dates: October 12-November 4, 2023
- 2,068 completed interviews (28% response rate)
- The average margin of error is +/- 2,2%
  - Note: the margin of error is different for every response
- Face-to-face survey.

Note: March 2023, March 2022, February 2022, December 2021, July 2021, February 2021, December 2020, August 2020 polls were conducted over telephones.

#### SAMPLE

- ❖ A nationally representative sample (excluding occupied territories) including oversampled areas of the Capital, large Urban, Small Urban, Rural and Minority Settlements;
- Large Urban stratum consists of cities with a population 40K or more: Batumi, Zugdidi, Rustavi, Poti, Gori, and Kutaisi;
- Small Urban stratum consists of the rest of the cities/dabas holding urban status;
- Minority stratum consists of settlements, where ethnic minorities (mostly Armenians & Azerbaijani) compose at least 40% of the voters in given settlement. Settlements within this stratum are dispersed throughout Kvemo Kartli, Samtskhe-Javakheti & Kakheti regions.

### Survey methodology

We use random sampling at all stages. We use a complex survey design:

- Stratification dividing population in relatively homogeneous sub-groups; and
- Clustering randomly selecting small geographic areas for each sub-group (stratum).
- Households are selected via random route sampling;
- Respondents are selected using a Kish table;
- Randomly selected households and individuals are not substituted;
- All interviews were conducted face-to-face with 18+ population, using tablets, in Georgian, Armenian, and Azerbaijani languages.

### **Quality control**

- All interviewers receive special training;
- CRRC central office coordinators conduct quality control interviews.

### Major findings

- The new survey, which was conducted before the European Commission's November 8th decision, reaffirms the unwavering dedication of the Georgian people to European integration, with an impressive 79 percent expressing support for EU membership. Over the last year, public opinion trends show a significant increase in favor of political and economic cooperation with the EU.
- ➤ The survey shows that poverty and economic problems are identified as main contributors to a sense of insecurity a finding that transcends party lines. Although a plurality acknowledges improvement in healthcare, freedom of speech, and women's rights and education, every second Georgian says the situation regarding poverty and crime has worsened.
- > One in ten Georgians can't afford food, while one in four can only afford food, but nothing else. This number is even more distressing in ethnic minority regions, where a quarter of residents reportedly struggle to provide food for their families.
- ➤ Georgians, irrespective of political affiliations, share a profound concern regarding the adverse impacts of emigration. 16 percent express intentions to emigrate, while the majority says they personally know someone who has already emigrated in the last 12 months. Low salaries and a dearth of job opportunities are cited as the primary driving factors behind this emigration trend.

### Major findings

- Absolute majority says mental health services should be covered by the state insurance package. Further, homeless animals, particularly dogs, now take the spotlight as the number one local problem. The survey reveals an alarming increase in the severity of this issue since 2020. The majority (68 percent) across all demographic groups is concerned about this topic, especially in small cities and Tbilisi.
- ➤ The majority consider poor quality of education as the leading problem facing the education system, while high cost of drugs and medical services are considered as leading problems in the healthcare system. The majority says that depression and anxiety is problematic for Georgian society, with almost every second Georgian (41 percent) saying they don't know who to address for help.
- Public disillusionment with parties continues 62 percent of Georgians say none of the parties represent their interests. A breakdown by party support shows that every fifth GD supporter, almost every second opposition supporter, and the majority of undecided say none of the parties represent their interests. Further, the majority (53 percent) says MPs do not take into account opinions of people like them.







#### In your opinion, is Georgia a democracy now?















GD supporter, compared to others, more likely to name inflation, high drug prices, low level of education and healthcare problems as the main cause of their insecurity, while opposition supporters are more likely to name crime, political instability and Russian actions in Georgia.















## For each issue, how do you think the situation has changed in Georgia in the last 10 years? Has it gotten worse, stayed the same or gotten better? (q14)






### What are three biggest issues facing the education system in Georgia today? Up to three answers. (q16)


### What are three biggest issues facing the healthcare system today? Up to three answers. (q17)











How important or unimportant do you think it is for mental healthcare services (including counseling, medicine and hospitalization) to be covered through public health insurance? (q53)




























#### How likely or unlikely is it that you will go abroad for work in the next 12 months? (q21)


























#### **How would you rate the performance of the prime minister?** (q8\_3)



#### How would you rate the performance of the Prime minister Irakli Gharibashvili? (q8\_3 X Settlement, Age, Gender, Party closest to you)










#### How would you rate the performance of the Parliament?




#### If an MP were to contact you, what would be the best form? (q12)




#### Do you believe that at least one political party in Georgia that more or less represents your interests? (q9)

Do you believe that at least one political party in Georgia that more or less represents your interests? (q9 X Settlement, Age, Gender, Party closest to you)




# Majority remain politically undecided


### There are a number of political parties in Georgia. Which political party is closest to you? (q10)
















































