Why We Conduct Polls?

➤ Foster the development of more responsive policies and governance;

➤ Help stakeholders diagnose and address issues of public concern;

- ☐ leaders from across the political spectrum have reported that the polls are important to their work and encourage continued polling;
 - ☐ Inclusive process: the polling instrument was developed in consultation with parties, government, and civil society leaders;

Information about the poll

- Fieldwork dates: February 23 March 14, 2016
- ➤ 3,900 completed interviews
- ➤ A nationally representative sample including oversampled areas of the Capital, Urban and Rural settlements, ethnic minority settlements
- ➤ The average margin of error is +/- 1,6%

Methodology


Sample design

NDI and CRRC use a complex survey design:

- ✓ Stratification dividing population in relatively homogenous subgroups
- ✓ Clustering randomly selecting small geographic areas for each subgroup (stratum)
- > Households are selected via random route sampling
- > Respondents are selected using a Kish table
- Randomly selected households and individuals are not substituted
- All interviews were conducted face-to-face, in Georgian, Armenian and Azeri.

How NDI Survey is Conducted

At the first stage, CRRC randomly selects voting precincts in Georgia. Interviewers are sent there with given starting point, directions for walking, step size, number of contacts.



Interviewer randomly selectes households according to the given step size, e.g. every 3rd, 5th, 8th...

The respondent is selected randomly, with special method - so called Kish grid. Selected respondent cannot be replaced.






Interviewer conducts an interview with the selected household member. Intervewer uses tablet computer and a special software.

Interviewer submits the results via the internet to the special server.












CRRC cleans and analyses collected data, which later is presented to the public.



Which of the following best describes your knowledge of the parliament's work? (q25)




Which of the following best describes your knowledge of the parliament's work? (q25 X Settlement)




Who is your majoritarian member in the Parliament of Georgia? (q26)




What do you expect from a Member of the Parliament (MP)? (q27)




What do you expect from your majoritarian MP? (q39)




What do you expect from a Member of the Parliament (MP)? Will do what the party tells him/her to do (q27_3 X Settlement)




What do you expect from a Member of the Parliament (MP)? Will only serve his/her own interests (q27_2 X Settlement)






Have you addressed a member of the Parliament or their bureau/office with any request or concern since the October 2012 parliamentary election? (q28)







Have you personally been contacted by a MP or his/her staff since the October 2012 parliamentary elections? (q30)




Have you personally been contacted by a MP or his/her staff since the October 2012 parliamentary elections? (q30 X Settlement)










Overall, since 2012 do you think the parliament is working better, the same or worse? (q33)




Overall, since 2012 do you think the parliament is working better, the same or worse? (q33 X Settlement)










How do you receive information about the parliament? Name up to three (q24)






Out of 150 members of Parliament how many do you think are women? (q35)






What would be the best proportion of men and women members in parliament? (q36)








How important or unimportant is to introduce gender quota? (q37)












Which of the following statements do you agree with? (q6)




Which of the following statements do you agree with? (q6 X Party closest to you)








If parliamentary elections were held tomorrow, would you say you are decided or undecided about how you would vote? (q52 X Settlement)



Which party is closest to you? (q50)








If parliamentary elections were held tomorrow, which party do you think would win? (q51)






If parliamentary elections were held tomorrow, would you vote? (q53 X Settlement)




If parliamentary elections were held tomorrow, would you vote? (q53 X Party closest to you)






If parliamentary elections were held tomorrow, which party would you vote for? Whole sample (q54)




If parliamentary elections were held tomorrow, which party would you vote for? Likely voters only (q54)




If parliamentary elections were held tomorrow, which party would you vote for? Decided likely voters only (30%) (q54)






