


METHODOLOGY

- The National Democratic Institute (NDI) commissioned this poll from the Lebanese research and consultancy firm, based in Beirut, Information International.
- Data was collected between December 19, 2017 and January 14, 2018, through face-to-face interviews conducted in Arabic by trained field researchers.
- The survey sample size of 2,400 Lebanese citizens, aged 21 years and older (54 percent male, 46 percent female). The response rate was 83.7 percent.
- Sample respondents were selected using the Probability Proportional to Size (PPS) methodology, based on demographic data drawn from national government registries including the 2017 voter registry.
- Data collected included opinions of eligible voters on subjects including electoral reforms and the upcoming parliamentary elections, politicians, political parties, and citizen movements, as well as government performance.
- The poll was made possible thanks to the support of the UK Government's Foreign Commonwealth Office (FCO).
- The margin of error is ±2 percent at a 95 percent level of confidence.
- The information included in this report was gathered in accordance with international standards in market and social research.
- The total of percentages might not equal 100 percent in all graphs due to rounding.



In general, do you believe the situation in Lebanon is heading in the right direction or the wrong direction?




Of the list, which national issues are most important to you and your family?



How do you think the situation has changed in Lebanon since the new government took office in December?






If you answered "not very likely" or "I won't vote" in question 16, what could change your mind?



To what extent do you think the following violations will occur in upcoming elections?




When you consider parliamentary elections and these institution's role, what is your view about them?




How would you like to interact with candidates during upcoming elections?




Different reasons are given for the fact that there are fewer women than men in elected office in Lebanon.

Which, if any of the following statements do you agree with?






If there were an equal balance of men and women in office, in your opinion, would there be...?




Which sources do you use to access information about politics?
