Why We Conduct Polls?

- Foster the development of more responsive policies and governance;
- Help stakeholders diagnose and address issues of public concern;

leaders from across the political spectrum have reported that the polls are important to their work and encourage continued polling;

Inclusive process: the polling instrument was developed in consultation with parties, government, and civil society leaders;

Information about the poll

- Fieldwork dates: November 29 December 19, 2017
- 2, 298 completed interviews (48% response rate)
- A nationally representative sample (excluding occupied territories) including oversampled areas of the <u>Capital</u>, <u>large Urban</u>, <u>small Urban</u>, <u>Rural</u> and <u>minority</u> <u>settlements</u>
- Iarge Urban stratum consists of the cities with 40K and more population: Batumi, Zugdidi, Rustavi, Poti, Gori, Kutaisi
- Small Urban stratum consists of the rest of the cities/dabas holding urban status
- Minority stratum consists of population of those settlements, where ethnic minorities (mostly Armenians and Azeri) make at least 40% of the voters in given settlement. Settlements within this stratum are dispersed through Kvemo Kartli, Samtskhe-Javakheti and kakheti regions.
- The average margin of error is +/- 1,9%

Methodology


Sample design

NDI and CRRC use a complex survey design:


- Stratification dividing population in relatively homogenous sub-groups
- Clustering randomly selecting small geographic areas for each sub-group (stratum)
- Households are selected via random route sampling
- Respondents are selected using a Kish table
- Randomly selected households and individuals are not substituted
- All interviews were conducted face-to-face, in Georgian, Armenian and Azeri.






Who is your majoritarian member in the Parliament of Georgia? (q39 X Settlement)





What do you expect from the member of the Parliament (MP)? (q38) Tbilisi




How much do you agree or disagree that members of parliament take into account opinions of people like you? (q40)




Do you agree or disagree that members of parliament take into account opinions of people like you? (q40 X Settlement)




To what extent do you agree or disagree with the following statement: If you wanted to, you would be able to easily arrange a meeting with the Member of Parliament. (q41)






Have you ever been involved in the work of the parliament in following ways ...? (q42)




Have you ever been involved in the work of the parliament in following ways? (q42) Tbilisi






To what extent do you support or oppose adopting mandatory quota in the parliament to increase women's participation? (q46)



Respondents were provided with the definition of quota: Gender quota is a temporary mechanism, which makes it mandatory for Georgian political parties to include certain number of different gender (mostly women) in their party lists. This mechanism ensures women's better representation in the parliament, as well as at other decision-making levels.


Do you support or oppose adopting mandatory quota in the parliament to increase women's participation? (q46 X Gender)




Do you support or oppose adopting mandatory quota in the parliament to increase women's participation? (q46 X Age)




In your opinion, what would be the best proportion of men and women members in parliament? (q47)




Currently approximately 13% of all Sakrebulo members elected during local government elections are women. Do you think this is ...? (q48)








Do Georgian male politicians treat their female colleagues as equals or not? (q50)




Do Georgian female politicians treat male colleagues as equals or not? (q51)






Would you support or oppose parliament adopting a law against sexual harassment? (q53)





Would you support or oppose parliament adopting a law against sexual harassment? (q53 X Gender)












Do you feel you have enough information about the constitutional changes? (q57) - of the 25% who was aware of this process

In June 2017, 39% of the population who was aware of the process said they felt they had enough information about the constitutional changes.




Do you feel you have enough information about the constitutional changes? (q57 X Settlement) - of those who were aware of this process




Do you believe the changes in the constitution fully reflect, partially reflect or do not reflect at all the citizens' opinions? (q58) - of those, who were aware of the process




Do you believe the changes in the constitution fully reflect, partially reflect or do not reflect at all the citizens' opinions? (q58 X Settlement) - of those who were aware










Do you agree or disagree with each statement? (q62 X Settlement) - of the those who has heard about Kashia's action




Do you agree or disagree with each statement? (q62 X Age) - of those who heard about Kashia's action




