
Methodology - Current Wave


- This research has been conducted over multiple waves. The funding for this wave was provided by the Swedish International Development and Cooperation Agency (Sida)
- Current survey wave:
 - Fieldwork dates: June 12 26, 2013
 - 2,338 completed interviews
 - A nationally representative sample of Georgian speakers including Capital, Urban, Rural, East Georgia and West Georgia areas.
- Sample design
 - NDI and CRRC use a complex survey design with both stratification and clustering
 - Households are selected via random route sampling
 - Respondents are selected using a Kish table
 - Randomly selected households and individuals are not substituted
 - All interviews are conducted face-to-face
- The average margin of error is +/- 2.9%


Methodology – Historical Waves


- This research has been conducted over multiple waves. The funding for most waves was provided by Sida, however one wave was funded by the Eurasia Foundation and one by the British Embassy
- Historical waves:
 - March 2013:
 - Fieldwork dates: March 13 27, 2013
 - 3,103 completed interviews
 - A nationally representative sample of Georgian speakers including Capital, Urban, Rural, East Georgia and West Georgia areas.
 - The average margin of error does not exceed +/- 2.5%
 - November 2012
 - Fieldwork dates: November 14 25, 2012
 - 1,947 completed interviews
 - A nationally representative sample including capital, urban, rural, East Georgia and West Georgia areas
 - The average margin of error does not exceed +/- 3%
 - August 2012
 - Fieldwork dates: July 31 August 12, 2012
 - 2,038 completed interviews
 - A nationally representative sample including Capital, urban and rural areas.
 - The average margin of error does not exceed +/- 3%
















How would you rate the performance of ...? (q58) Part 1








How would you assess Prime Minister Ivanishvili's performance in ...? (q59) Part 1




How would you assess Prime Minister Ivanishvili's performance in ...? (q59) Part 2



How would you rate the performance of the Parliament? (q58)




How would you rate the performance of Your local government? (q58)




Which political party or bloc do you trust most to manage the following issues? (q62) Part 1



Party Crosstabs

What is a crosstab?


A crosstab shows the relationship between two questions. In other words, it can show how people who are in one category (party closest to you, in this presentation) answered other questions. Other examples which might be more familiar are gender, settlement and age.

The next few slides show how respondents for Georgian Dream, "no party", UNM, "don't know" and "refuse to answer" and "other" are different or similar to each other.

A crosstab demonstrates the relationship between two questions. It does not show if there is a dependent relationship between those two questions.






In which direction is Georgia going? (q10 X Party closest to you)



Is Georgia a democracy now? (q14 X Party closest to you)




How important or unimportant is the protection of minority rights? (q19a/q19b X Party closest to you)





To what extent do you agree or disagree that the current government is making the changes that matter to you? (q11 X Part closest to you)




How important is it, if at all, that there is a strong opposition party in the country? (q16 X Settlement)



How important is it, if at all, that there is a strong opposition party in the country? (q16 X Party closest to you)




Do you personally know someone who you believe was fired from a state/public job because of their political beliefs since October 2012? (q68 X Party closest to you)




Which of the following statements do you agree with the most? (q46 X Party closest to you)






Are you satisfied or dissatisfied with Georgia's current relationship with Russia? (q47 X Party closest to you)





How important is it, if at all, that there is a strong opposition party in the country? (q16)




Which party do you consider to be the strongest opposition in Georgia? (q17)


If presidential elections were held tomorrow, would you vote? (q63)



If presidential elections were held tomorrow, would you vote? (q63 X Party closest to you)


