### Why We Conduct Polls?

- Foster the development of more responsive policies and governance;
- > Help stakeholders diagnose and address issues of public concern;

□leaders from across the political spectrum have reported that the polls are important to their work and encourage continued polling;

□Inclusive process: the polling instrument was developed in consultation with parties, government, and civil society leaders;

### About the poll

- Fieldwork dates: June 23 Jul 8, 2018
- > 2409 completed interviews (49% response rate)
- ➤ The average margin of error is +/- 1,9%
  - > Note: the margin of error is different for every response

#### Sample

- A nationally representative sample (excluding occupied territories) including oversampled areas of the <u>Capital</u>, <u>large Urban</u>, <u>small Urban</u>, <u>Rural</u> and <u>minority settlements</u>
- Iarge Urban stratum consists of the cities with 40K and more population: Batumi, Zugdidi, Rustavi, Poti, Gori, Kutaisi
- Small Urban stratum consists of the rest of the cities/dabas holding urban status
- Minority stratum consists of population of those settlements, where ethnic minorities (mostly Armenians and Azeri) make at least 40% of the voters in given settlement. Settlements within this stratum are dispersed through Kvemo Kartli, Samtskhe-Javakheti and kakheti regions.


#### Methodology

We use random sampling at all stages. NDI and CRRC use a complex survey design:

- ✓ **Stratification** dividing population in relatively homogenous sub-groups
- Clustering randomly selecting small geographic areas for each sub-group (stratum)
- Households are selected via random route sampling
- Respondents are selected using a Kish table
- Randomly selected households and individuals are not substituted
- All interviews were conducted face-to-face with 18+ population, using tablets, in Georgian, Armenian and Azeri.

#### **Quality control**


- All interviewers received special training
- CRRC central office coordinators conducted quality control interviews
















#### For each issue how do you think the situation has changed in Georgia in the last 10 years? (q3)




### How would you evaluate current situation of Georgia's economy? (q6)














#### Do you approve or disapprove of Georgian government's stated goal to join the EU? (q44)




#### Do you approve or disapprove of Georgian government's stated goal to join the EU? (q44 X Settlement)



### Do you approve or disapprove of Georgian government's stated goal to join NATO? (q45)










# In the city or area where you live, are you satisfied or dissatisfied with the quality of air? (q22 X Settlement)



How much would you say you trust or distrust safety of agricultural products cultivated in Georgia? (q23)




## What is the main source of drinking water supply for your family? (q24)










#### Do you approve or disapprove of Prime Minister Giorgi Kvirikashvili resigning? (q40)





#### If Presidential elections were held tomorrow, would you say you are decided or undecided about how you would vote? (q47)








If Presidential elections were held tomorrow, would you say you are decided or undecided about how you would vote? (q47 X If Presidential elections were held tomorrow, would you vote?)




#### If presidential elections were tomorrow, who would you vote for? (q49a) Whole sample




#### If presidential elections were tomorrow, who would you vote for? (q49a) likely voters only




## If presidential elections were tomorrow, who would you vote for? (q49b) Whole sample






#### How would you describe your support for your first choice? (q50) - of the 37% who name a specific candidate they would vote for




## Who will you vote for if you have following two candidates in the 2nd round? (q51)


















#### How do you think the coming Presidential election will be conducted/managed by Central Election Commission (CEC)? (q58)





## If Parliamentary elections were held tomorrow, would you vote? (q60)








